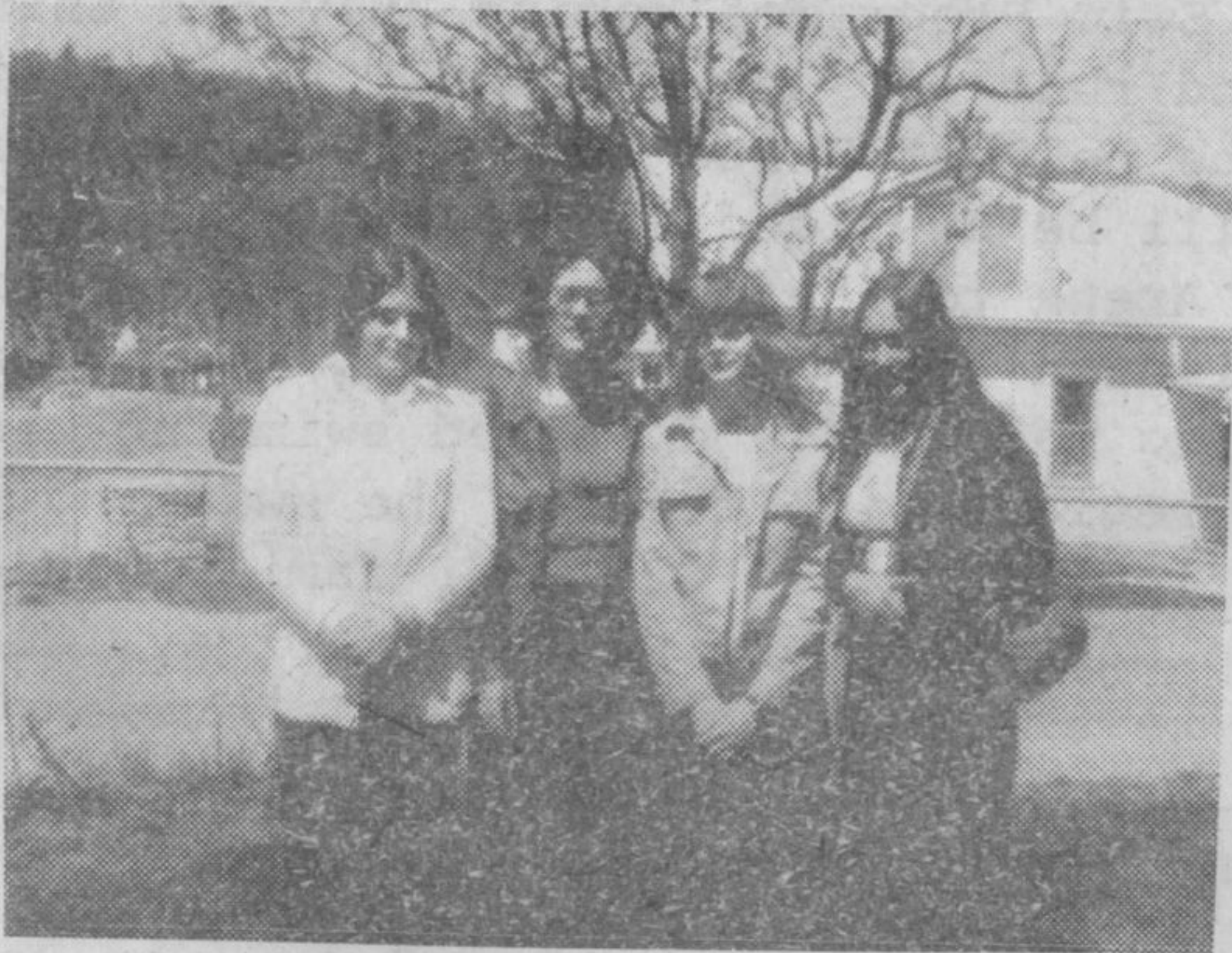


RUN - A - LAP

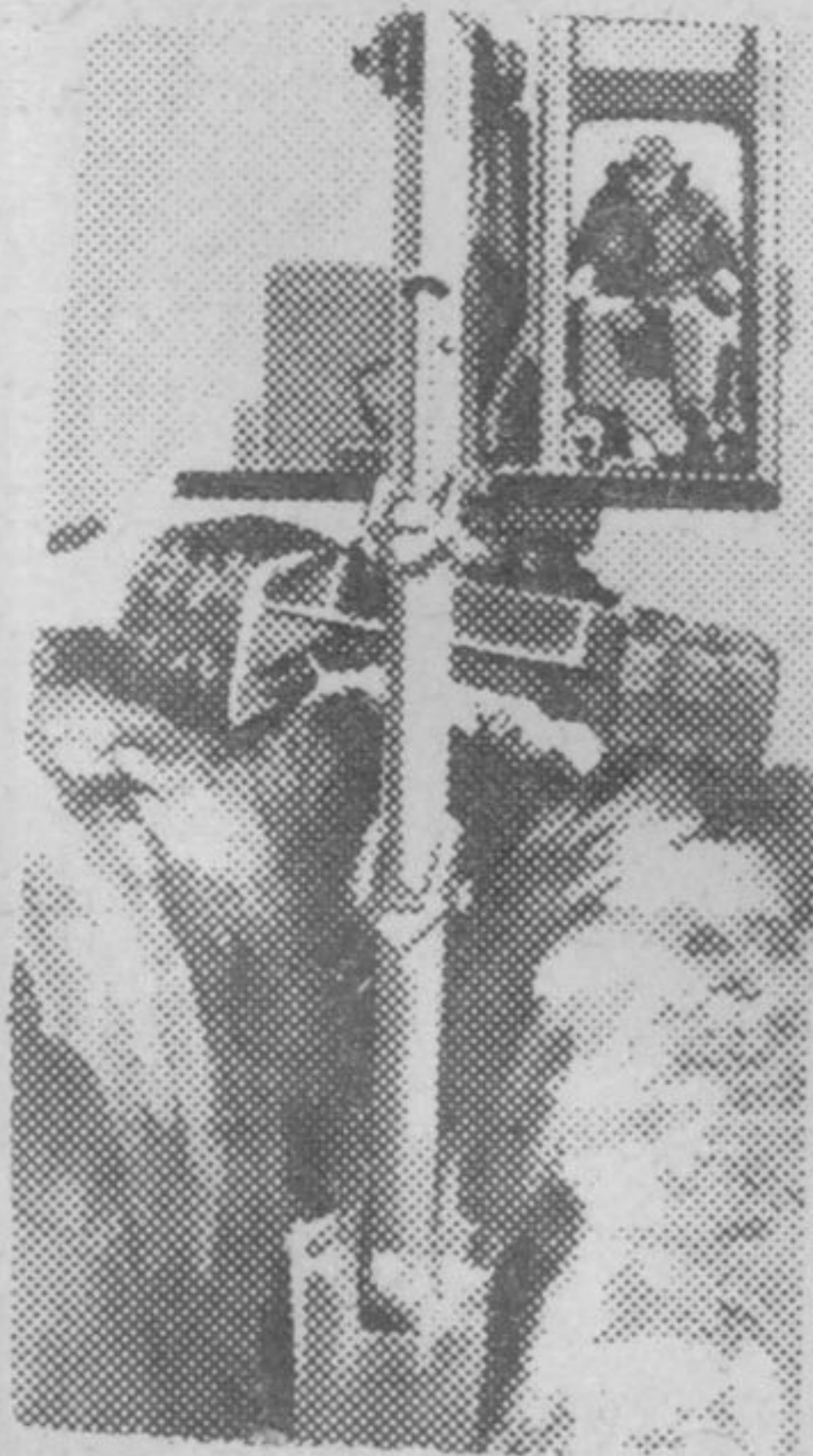
SCHREIBER SOCIAL SPECTRUM
