**TERRACE BAY POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT**

During the period June 21st to July 5th, 1976 a total of forty two occurrences were received and investigated.

There were seventeen house checks, one dog complaint, one child complaint, one parking complaint, three assistance, one public two other police forces, two disturbances - persons responsible warned, one fraud under investigation, one property damage (window of Recreation Office), one break, enter and theft (Boy Scout Hall), one impaired driver to appear in court August 5, 1976, two thefts under \$200.00 under investigation, seven motor vehicles spot checks and three charges under the Highway Traffic Act.
