A Fall premium will be delivered to members later in the summer.

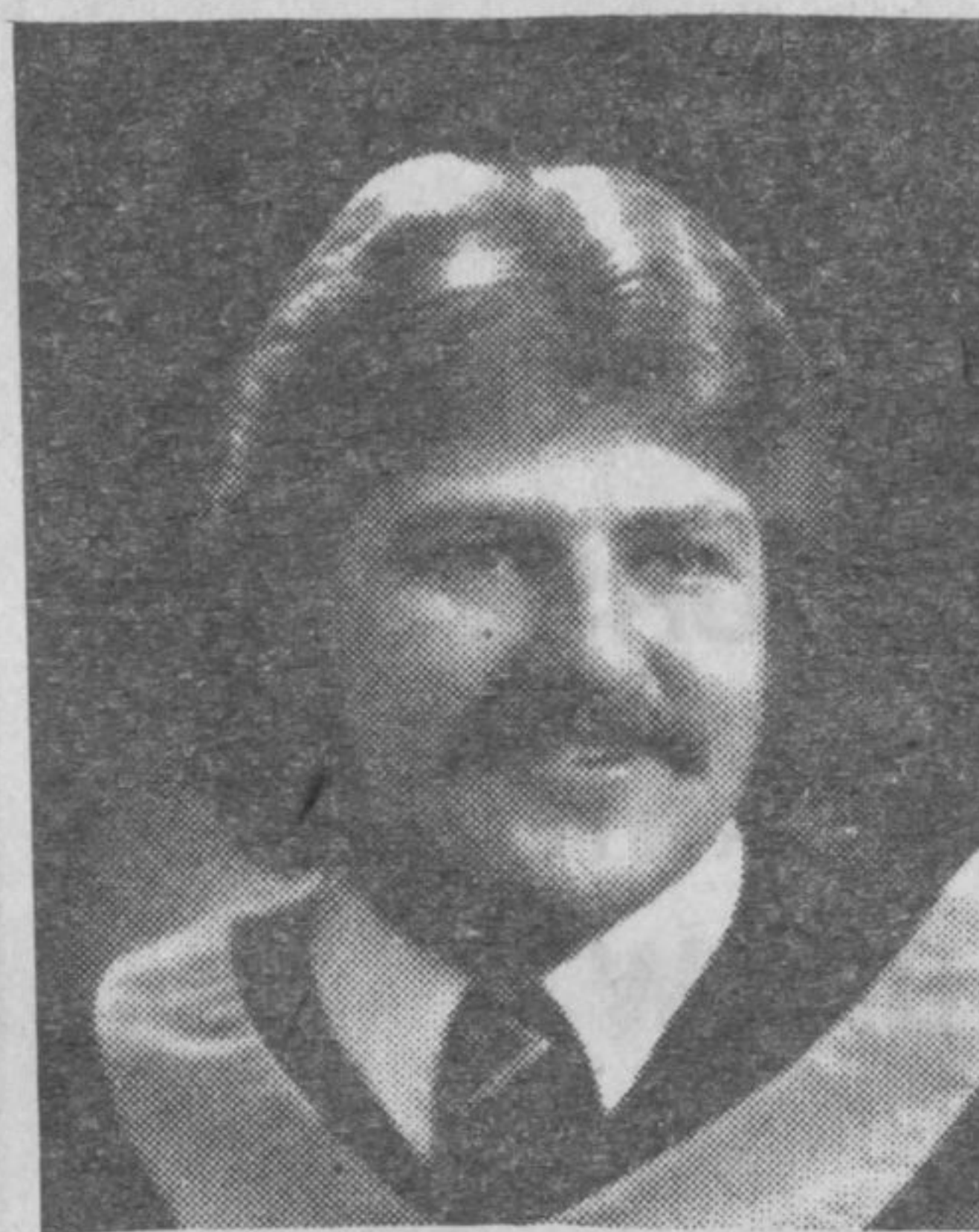
The Plant Rummage Sale was again a success. Demand exceeded supply so please make a note to donate your extra perennials or annuals next year.

Mr. Harry Coe recently accompanied his son, Ralph, to London where they attended the Spring Convocation Exercises at the University of Western Ontario.

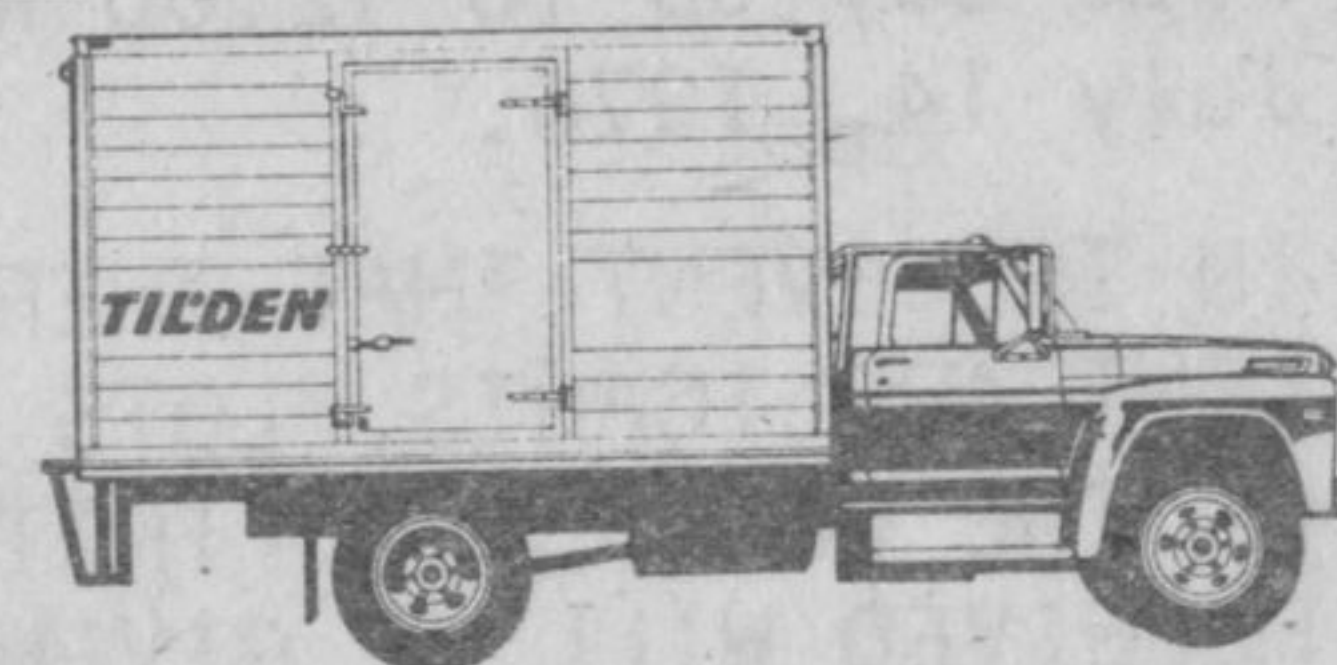
Ralph graduated from Western with his Honours Bachelor of Science majoring in zoology.
