Amid mild confusion and pandamonium, Geraldton hosted their annual ladies softball tournament this weekend.

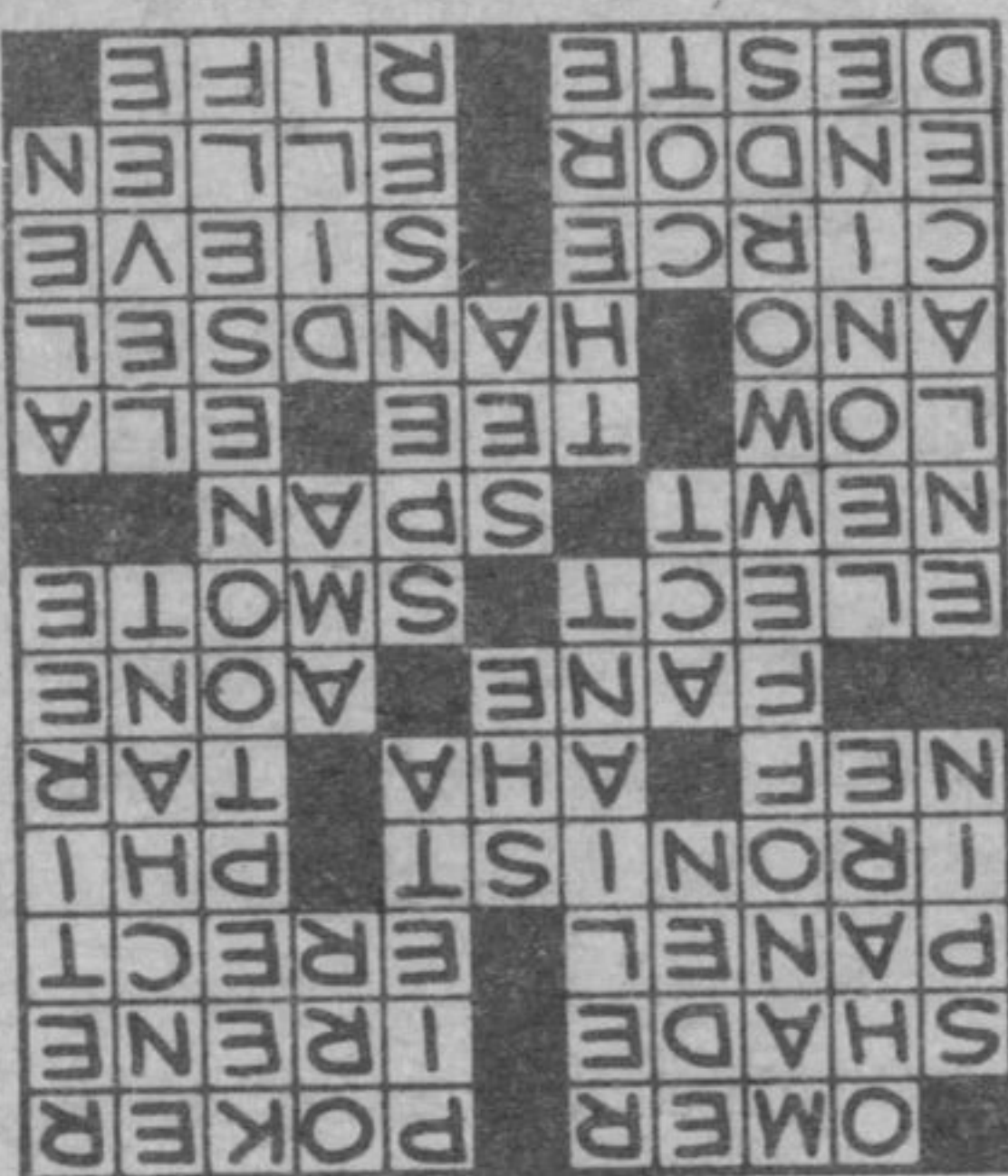
In attendance were three teams from Geraldton, two teams from Longlac, one from Hearst, some Terrace Bay cuties and our own Schreiber girls.
