3. If the consumer complaint office cannot resolve the issue, that office will refer the complaint to the headquarters of the Department of Consumer Affairs.

4. The Department of Consumer and Corporate
Affairs will keep in close touch with Metric
Commission Canada regarding complaints, so
that the Department or the Commission can work
with industry to take steps to correct any
pricing problem needing adjustment.

5. The Department of Consumer and Corporate
Affairs will also be in close liaison with the
Anti-Inflation Board regarding complaints of
this nature. The Board may use this information in monitoring the pricing policies of
companies subject to mandatory enforcement of
the AIB guidelines.
