## TERRACE BAY POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Terrace Bay Police investigated thirtyseven occurences during the week of October 26 to September 2, 1976.

On September 27 it was reported that a number of camp residents rooms had been entered and personal property removed.

During the late evening hours on September 27 culprits broke into Cebrario's Hardware.

At 5:20 p.m., September 27, it was reported that three young girls had been approached by a man in his late twenties, described as 5' 8" tall, 180 pounds with brown shoulder length hair. This man was reported to be driving a late model intermediate sized car with a black top, silver bottom. Although no physical harm came to these girls it is a matter of great concern both to parents and to the constables on the department. The police are requesting that parents speak to their children advising them not to speak to or accept rides from strangers. Although there has not been an reoccurence of this type of offence we cannot take it lightly. Until the police are sure that this man was just travelling through this area, or is apprehended, please use all due caution. Any assistance the public could render will be greatly appreciated.
