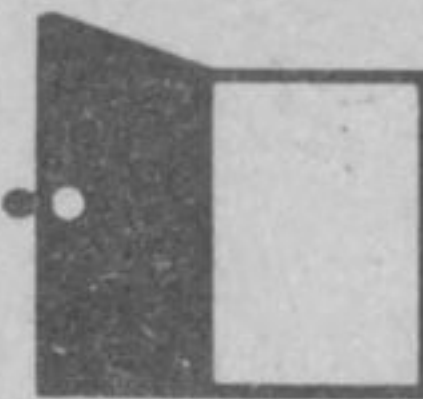
The premiums to members are being delivered during this week. Premium consists of two tulip and one crocus bulb for fall planting.
