During the early hours of October 9/76 the Robinsons store was broken into. Investigation into this occurrence have resulted in juvenile charges being laid against a Schreiber youth.

During the week, 18 cars were safety checked, 8 compassionate messages were delivered and 11 instances of assistance to public were noted.

It has come to the attention of this department the increasing amount of accidents occurring at the Mill Road and Highway #17. Subsequently enforcement of the Highway Traffic Act with regards to the stop sign at the mill road and Highway 17 will be increased.

Who Uses the CPI for What

The Consumer Price Index is used by governments, business, labor, research and consumer groups, economists and individuals for many different reasons.

The Prime Minister is measuring the national goals for fighting inflation against the performance of the CPI. This year's target is to limit the CPI increase to 8 per cent.

Business and labor use the CPI to calculate and negotiate cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) clauses. The Canadian Labour Congress says some of its member unions use it when bargaining for cost-of-living allowances. Anyone whose salary contains this

COLA clause receives an increase in his pay periodically, taking into consideration the increase in the prices of consumer goods as measured by the CPI.

Consumer groups, such as the Consumer Association of Canada, use the CPI to determine the current value of the dollar compared with past years, in their presentations to business or government on behalf of Canadian consumers.

Through the CPI, individuals can become more aware of the general economy, which can help them manage their personal economics in the most advantageous manner.
