SMOKING IN THE HOSPITAL:

In accordance with a resolution passed by the Canadian Hospital Association at its annual meeting in Saskatoon in June 1975, The McCausland Hospital, as of November 1st, 1976 is prohibiting smoking in patient's rooms and hallways adjacent to patient's rooms. The (original) waiting room of the hospital will be designated as the only smoking area for visitors and those patients who are permitted to move about.

In addition to the no smoking policy, cigarettes will no longer be sold from the tuck cart.

There are many reasons for the above policy; first for health reasons, but equally important patients suffering from ischemic heart disease, chronic bronchitis, asthma or emphysema are greatly distressed by cigarette smoke. Where oxygen is being administered or even when an oxygen cylinder is present "no smoking" is an absolute must. As the fire marshall has labelled the hospital as "danger ous in case of fire" (one of the many reasons for a new hospital) we can take no chances.

At the October (Tuesday 19th) meeting of The McCausland Hospital Board this "no smoking" resolution was passed. It is in the interest of all who use the hospital.
