Christmas in New Mexico

New Mexico, Land of Enchantment, is so called because of the beauty of the land and the history of its people. The Spanish conquerors who came to the area from Mexico, in 1540, to search for legendary gold, found only six small villages where Indians lived. The conquerors named the Indians *Pueblo*, a Spanish word for *village*.

In New Mexico, at the Santa Domingo Indian pueblo, the Christmas season is honored with a four day long, sacred ritual dance.

At 2 A.M. Christmas day

it starts. After midnight mass, the Indians gather inside the church, wearing colorful costumes decorated with everything from evergreen branches to fox tails.

The dancers carry on their ceremonials until dawn, when they move to their sacred plaza, where they continue dancing through the day.

The children dance on the second day, and on the third, the older members of the tribe take over.

The entire pueblo joins in day-long ceremonies on the last day, so ending this special celebration.

INFORMATION ONTARIO

ONTARIO SENIOR CITIZENS' PRIVILEGE CARD AND DRUG BENEFITS:

All residents of Ontario, age 65 and over, are entitled to an Ontario Senior Citizens' Privilege Card.

You may ask "What privileges does the card entitle me to?" Your Ontario Senior Citizens' Privilege card allows you to enjoy free of charge, or at reduced rates the following services and facilities: - All Ontario Provincial Parks. - Some businesses which offer special discounts for senior citizens (for example, movie theatres). - Many historical and cultural sites in Ontario such as Old Fort William, Ontario Science Centre, and Ontario Place. - Some transit systems that have senior citizen rates. Your local transit may also require that you use a specific card issued by them. - Ontario Drug Benefit.

Drug Benefit in Ontario applies to persons 65 or older who receive Federal Old Age Security; or the Guaranteed Annual Income System (GAINS) cheque; or who have resided in Ontario for the past 12 months.

The Drug Benefit provides, free of charge, the more than 1,500 drugs listed in Ontario's Drug Benefit Formulary. The Formulary does not list all drugs available but does contain enough to meet most medical needs.

Drug Benefits applies only to prescriptions filled in Ontario. Your card cannot be used outside the province.

If you have resided in Ontario for the past 12 months, but do not receive Old Age Security or GAINS cheques, you must apply for a numbered privilege card for Drug Benefit.

When using your Ontario Senior Citizens' Privilege Card for Drug Benefit, be sure to tell your doctor or dentist that you are eligible for Drug Benefit before a prescription is written. Your doctor or dentist should have your privilege card number when he or she phones your pharmacy regarding a prescription.

When you are going to the pharmacy to have a prescription filled be sure to show your card to the pharmacist, otherwise you may have to pay for medication.

Your Ontario Senior Citizens' Card must bear your signature, therefore you should sign it as soon as you receive it. Your signature also verifies that the card belongs to you. It cannot be used by anyone else and should not be let out of your possession. For further information write: Ontario Senior Citizens' Privilege Card, Queen's Park, Toronto, Ont.
