GUARANTEED INCOME SUPPLEMENT

Its that time of the year again when recipients of the Old Age Security Pension are receiving, or will have received, application forms for Guaranteed Income Supplement in the mail. The following information will be of benefit to those who receive Old Age Security Pension or will soon be eligible for Old Age Security.

A Guaranteed Income Supplement is a monthly payment added to the Old Age Security Pension of a pensioner who has no income, or only a limited amount of income.

The amount of the supplement is determined by a pensioner's marital status and income. Income does not include possessions, savings, investments, or a home or property that you may own, nor does it include (for the purposes of the guaranteed income supplement) the Old Age Security Pension itself. Income is any money you received in the form of retirement pensions, earnings, interest, dividends, rents, etc. If you are married, the combined income of you and your spouse must be taken into account.

If you are single and had no income in 1976 other than your
