

OPP INVESTIGATING BOMB EXPLOSION

A dynamite bomb shook the usually peaceful streets of Schreiber at 4:10 a.m. on Saturday morning.

A car belonging to Mr. Harry Martinson of Schreiber was mined during the night with one or two sticks of dynamite according to Schreiber O.P.P.

No motive for the bombing is known Mr. Martinson is popular in the community.

"We don't know of any motive", said a spokesman for Schreiber O.P.P.

"We hope its not a lunatic. Some people are afraid to start their car for fear of a device wired to the ignition".

Schreiber O.P.P. have enlisted the aid of Thunder Bay OPP's forensic science lab.

"We are treating this as a very serious matter", said the OPP spokesman. Maximum penalty for the offence is fourteen years imprisonment.

Damage to the undercarriage and interior of the car was heavy. Windows in the car and Mr. Martinson's house were blown out. No one was injured in the explosion.

The OPP are questioning local people and solicit confidential help from anyone who has any information.
