The trailer that became the main feature

In 1973 three partners, each with decades of experience in the forest-products industry, decided to manufacture custom-built logging trailers to bring the timber out of the woods. Vice-president John Marquis tells how the partners — with help from DREE — got things moving in a hurry:

"We noticed that most of the trailers the loggers were buying had to be modified in some way. So, we figured, why don't we go into the trailer-making business ourselves — and build trailers the right way in the first place?"

"We estimated that we could build and sell 60 trailers a year. We talked to DREE, the federal Department of Regional Economic Expansion, and they looked over our plans. 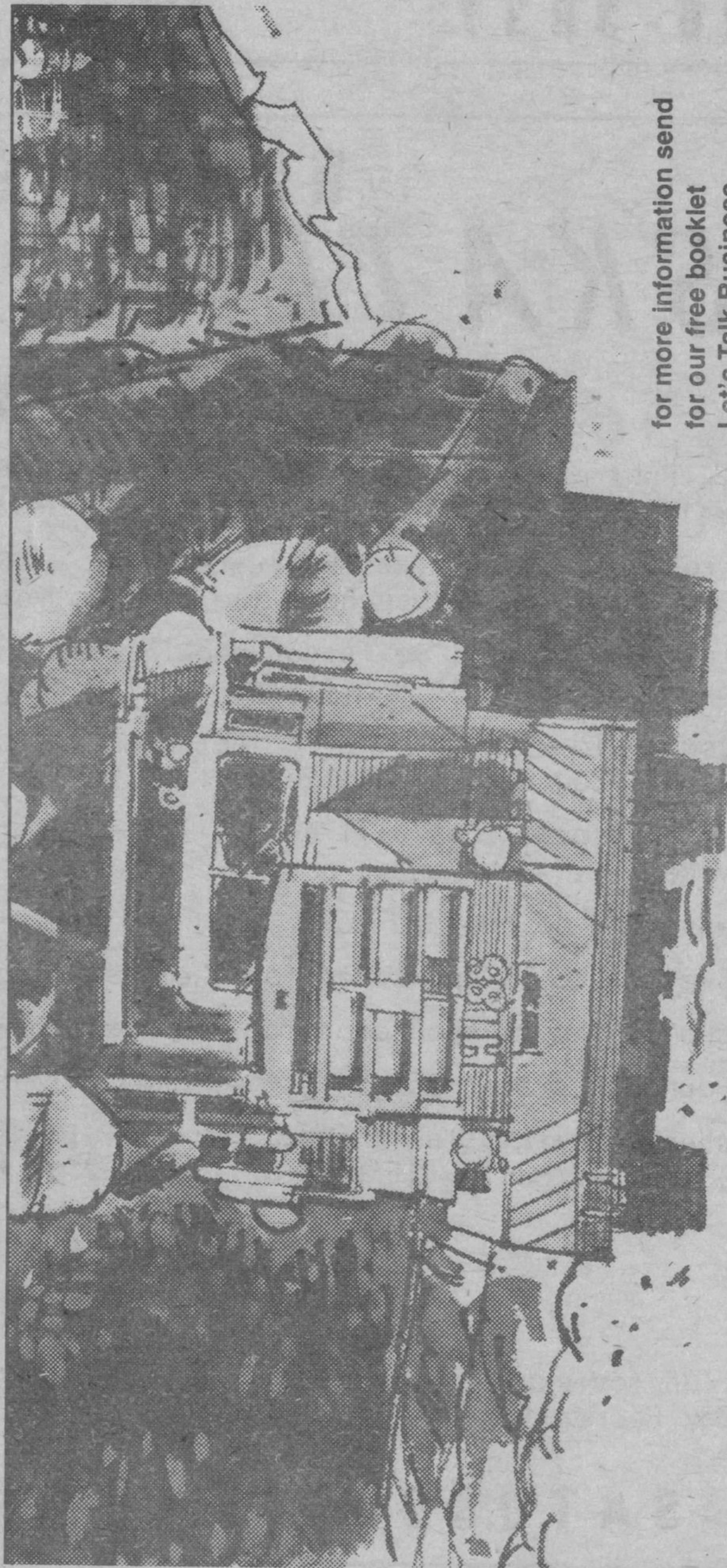
"In six months the demand for our custom trailers was so

great that it became necessary for us to double our production. DREE came to our aid a second time — and we now have over 45 men on the payroll and 13,500 square feet of manufacturing space. This summer we extended our range of products. Without DREE, this expansion would have been delayed by at least two years."
