The two Councils discussed the closing of the Dump to the public certain days of the week. They would like to have the Dump open to the public Tuesday, Friday and Saturday.

Accounts approved for payment were: Town-ship \$99,II8.48; Hydro \$45,I67.24; Library \$1,273.14; Recreation \$15,348.93.

Correspondence included notice of a desire to negotiate by the Service Employees Union Local 268 and the notice of election to the Child Welfare Budget Board 1977.

A letter to Kimberly Clark regarding the take over by the Town of the Sewage Treatment Plant servicing Terrace Heights set a date of June Ist for change of responsibility. The plant can handle I,000 residents.

Council agreed to turn down a request by Mr. N. Deschetallete to purchase a portion of Block B Superior Ave. Council would like to see the area maintained as a green belt. It is their policy not to sell these areas.

A notice of the Annual meeting of the Association of the Municipal Police Governing Authorities from March 3Ist to April Ist was filed.

It was moved that Bill Hanley attend and be remunerated for a seminar for Justices of the Peace in Thunder Bay March 9 & IOth.

It was voted that Town Council place a \$100.00 ad in the Town Carnival Booklet mentioning the history of Terrace Bay and thus supporting Winter Carnival. The Winter Carnival Committee informed Council that the booklets will be sold this year. Each booklet will be numbered and drawn for prizes during the Carnival.

Bill Hanley reported to Council that several people would like to buy lots of Block C, the area between the residences of M. Simmer and B. Cebrario on Lakeview Drive. Block C was originally zoned as a green belt but could be divided into four lots.

The residents on Lakeview would like the area to remain as a green belt. Council tabled the decision for later consideration if the influx of residents warranted the need for new lots.

Council has saved \$23,487.00 from the sale of lots on Lakeview and this revenue will remain in a separate account to finance the purchasing of two Police residences.

A payment of \$649.81 was authorized to the Sales Tax Consultant who went through the Town Council Books and saved the Town \$1298. on Sales tax charged to them throughout the year.
