

TERRACE BAY POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Terrace Bay Police Force was called upon to investigate twelve occurrences from March 1st to March 6th.

During this period of time, three motorists were charged with failing to have a valid licence sticker on their vehicle licence plate. Another motorist was charged with speeding 25 miles per hour over the posted speed limit. Three vehicle collisions of a minor nature were investigated with total damage estimated at \$600.00. One fail to remain accident is under police investigation after an unknown vehicle struck a parked van. Two men, one from Kenora and the other from Thunder Bay have been charged with assault causing bodily harm as a result of a complaint from a resident of the construction trailer camp.

CITIZEN OFFERS IDEAS ON RECREATION CENTRE RENOVATIONS

Terrace Bay Town Council met Monday, February 28th with all members present. Council denied a request from the North Shore Shooting Club to use the area behind the Moose Hall for the winter carnival turkey shoot, suggesting that they hold it on a gravel pit on the Kimberly-Clark road. Council cited safety as a major concern.

Council received a letter from a local woman requesting renovation work on the Terrace Bay Recreation Centre. She asked council to reduce the size of the washrooms, change the layout of the snack bar, and generally improve the interior of the facility. Council decided to keep her suggestions in mind when renovations begin and thanked her for her interest.

Reeve C. Brassard and Councillors Marg Hamilton and George Ramsay will travel to Thunder Bay for the annual Municipal League meeting March 11th and 12th.

Council has engaged a local contractor for street light relamping on a weekly basis. The anticipated cost to the town is thirty dollars per week.

Residents are reminded that the garbage contractor is now using two vehicles for his rounds. Therefore, the council suggests that all garbage be on the streets by 8 a.m.

Reeve Brassard asked Council to keep in mind ideas for the town clean-up campaign, and suggestions for improvements to unfinished buildings.

Council also passed a by-law regulating holidays, days off and work hours for non union, non association employees.

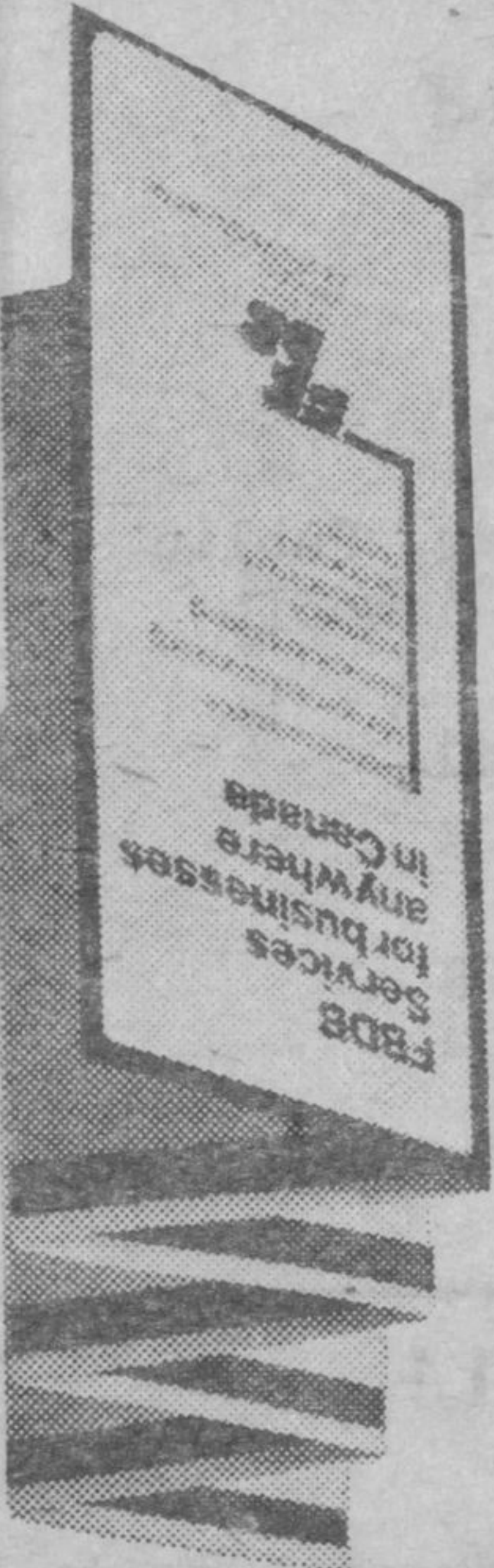
