The study is completed, a publication has been printed and is available from the National Institute or through your local association membership.

The main purpose of this book is to demonstrate that there is much known about retardation which if applied would substantially reduce the number of retarded children. What is more important is how to use this knowledge is the question to face, realizing what can and should be done.

This booklet divides the 200 known causes of mental retardation into environmental and medical causes. At the end of each chapter is included action steps for fair categories of readers - medical doctors, local associations, parents and concerned individuals and government agencies.

The President's Committee on Mental Retardation in the U. S. has stated "That the occurrence of mental retardation can be reduced by 50% by the year 2000. Prevention of mental retardation is an important step towards that goal.

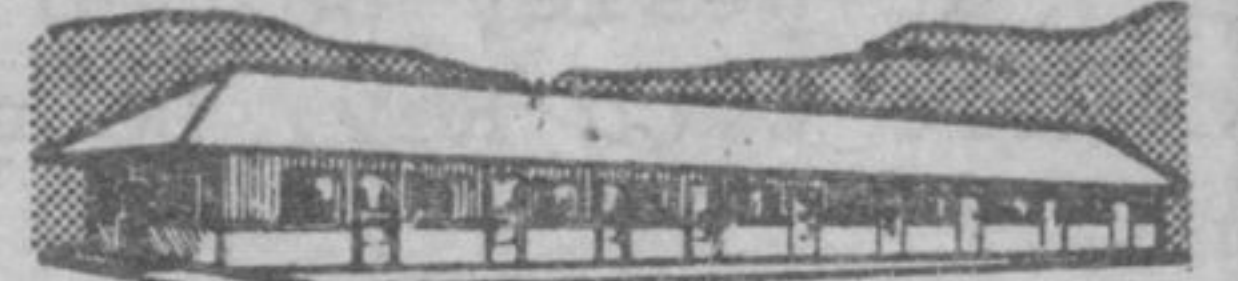
