

NEW McCAUSLAND HOSPITAL GOES TO TENDER IN AUGUST

Provincial funding for the replacement of the 23-bed McCausland Hospital, Terrace Bay, will allow the project to go to tender in August, Health Minister Dennis Timbrell announced.

The new 23-bed active treatment hospital will be located on Cartier Road, a short distance from the existing hospital. The new hospital will continue to serve Terrace Bay and the surrounding area.

The present 23-bed McCausland Hospital is a frame building built in 1951 and operated as a private hospital by Kimberly-Clark Pulp and Paper Company Limited until 1970 when it became a public hospital.

The Ontario Government will contribute five-sixths of the cost with the remainder to be raised by the local community.

Expected to go to tender in August, 1977, the new McCausland Hospital is scheduled for completion in February, 1979.

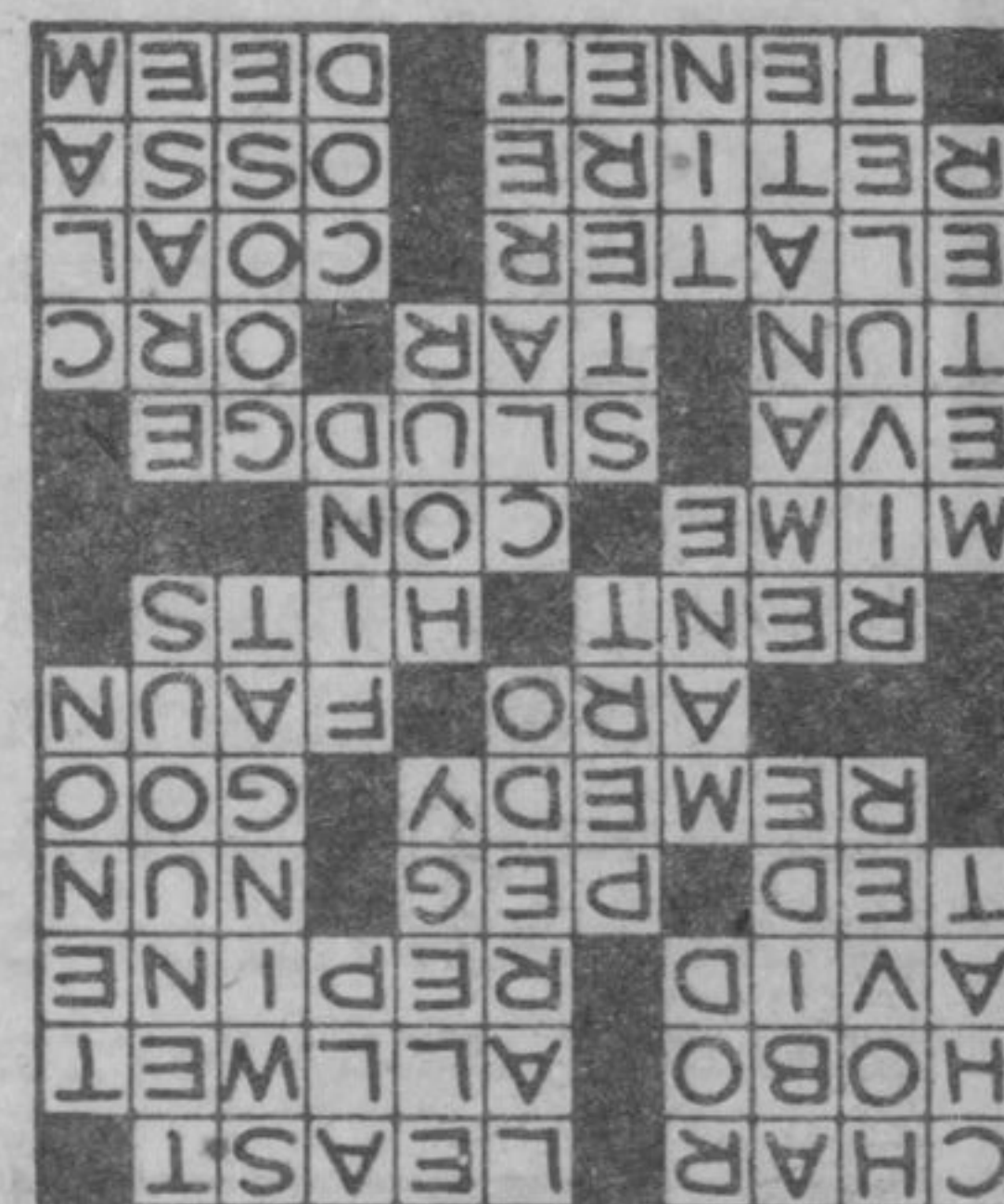
