POLICE REPORT 2-8 MAY 1977

The Terrace Bay Police Force was called upon to investigate twenty-nine occurrences during the period May 2nd to 8th.

Three local young people were charged in connection with the Break and Enter of the High School on April 30th. All three were charged with Break, Enter and committing mischief and will appear in court on 12 May 1977.

On May 4th, two large stones were thrown through the rear window of Robinson Stores and damage has been estimated at approximately \$50.00.

During the late evening of May 5th, a local youth smashed a large window in the Recreation Centre. This young man has been charged with mischief and being in possession of a weapon dangerous to the public peace and will appear in court on 12 May.

Police are attempting to eliminate some of the damage being done to the lawn in the park and other green belt areas within the townsite. As a result six motorcycle operators have been charged with various offences under the Highway Traffic Act of Ontario.

The public is invited to drop into the police office anytime during the day when the Terrace Bay Police observe National Police Week from 15-21 May. Mr. Harvey Ballard, age 68 years, of Oregon passed away in hospital on May 1st, 1977.

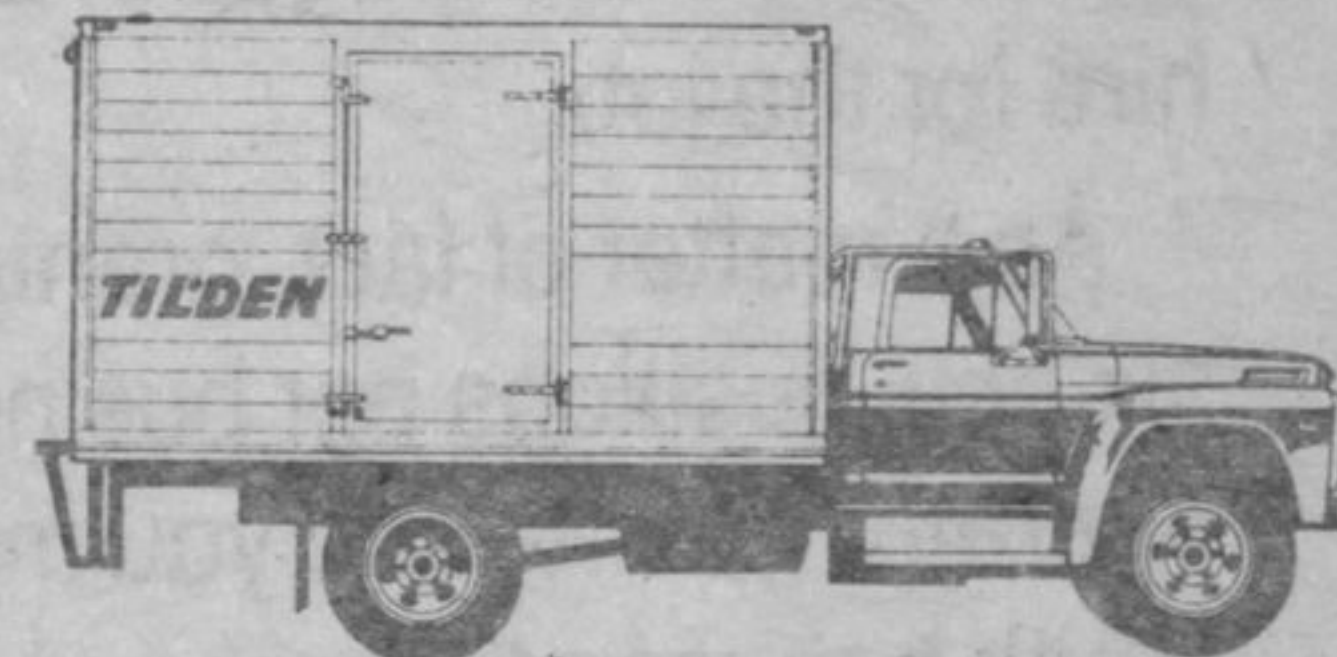
