

POLICE REPORT 9 - 15 MAY 1977

This past week police have been busy having investigated thirty-seven occurrences.

A local resident reported to police that his CB radio and antenna had been stolen. Police are also investigating a theft of a grinding unit and electrical tools from the expansion site.

One male person was arrested on a warrant held by Niagara Regional Police and was taken to the District Jail for an escort to arrive from St. Catharines. This past week, officers on patrol arrested one impaired driver. Five persons have been charged with various offences under the Liquor Licence Act of Ontario and one speeder was charged as he motored through town at 60 miles per hour.

Police were also called upon to attend a disturbance and two persons have been charged with causing a disturbance by fighting. One report of wilful damage has been reported when rocks were thrown through a window at Camerons Texaco.

FIRE PERMITS

Fire permits are issued free of charge. It doesn't cost you anything to get one before you burn, and it could cost you a lot if you burn without one.

They're easy to get. Just stop in at your nearest Ministry of Natural Resources Office, and tell them what you'll be burning, where you'll be burning it, and when. That way when the reports of smoke come in, the Ministry will know it's a controlled fire.

There are a lot of laws pertaining to the burning of grass, brush and debris. When you apply for your permit, the Ministry will tell you what they are, and suggest ways you can burn safely. Things like:

- Burn on a calm day with little wind.
- Burn before ten in the morning or after five at night - the coolest, dampest times of the day.
- Use an incinerator if possible. One made of metal covered with heavy wire mesh with holes not larger than 1/4 inch.
- Make sure your site is 15 ft. from any wooded area and clear a five-foot radius around the incinerator right down to bare rock or mineral soil.
- Never under any circumstances leave the fire unattended until you're sure it's dead out.
