ONTARIO ARTS COUNCIL GRANTS OVER \$3.2 MILLION IN SUPPORT OF THE ARTS:

Sixty-two organizations and 78 individuals in over 40 communities throughout Ontario have just been awarded grants totalling over \$3.2 million. This announcement was made following the May meeting of the Ontario Arts Council.

A total of 178 organizations and 85 individuals have received grants in our new fiscal year in visual arts, music, theatre, dance, film, photography, literature, touring, regional arts development, arts in education and the Franco-Ontarian community.
