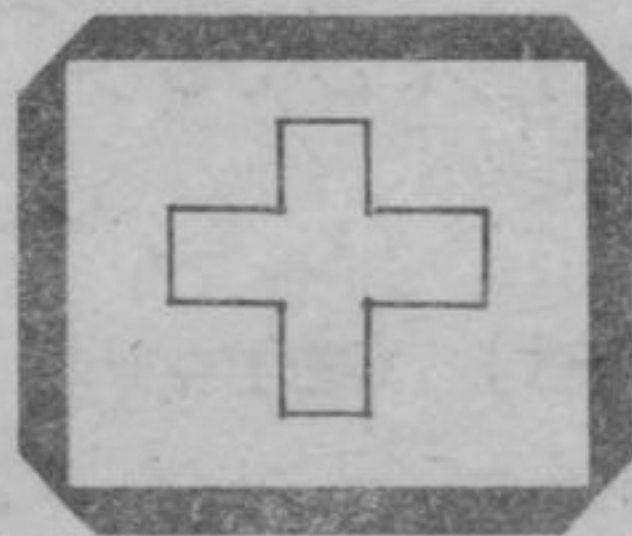

At this point the Board of Directors wish
