

POLICE REPORT: Continued

Five charges were laid under the Highway Traffic Act and are as follows, 1 charge of failing to wear a helmet, 2 charges of having no driver's licence, 1 charge of failing to produce a driver's licence, and one charge of failing to yield from a driveway.

A serious motor vehicle collision was investigated on May 29th on Highway 17 in the vicinity of Hudson Drive. Two motorcycles were in collision resulting in injuries to three local youths and extensive damage to the vehicles. John Curtis Cotton, Gerard Pineault and Ronald Kurylo were injured and taken to hospital and are being treated for a variety of injuries. Investigation is continuing into the cause of this accident.
