Mrs. Gail Savoy and daughter, Bonnie from St. Johns N.B. has been visiting for the past eleven days at the home of her Dad, H. Hart.

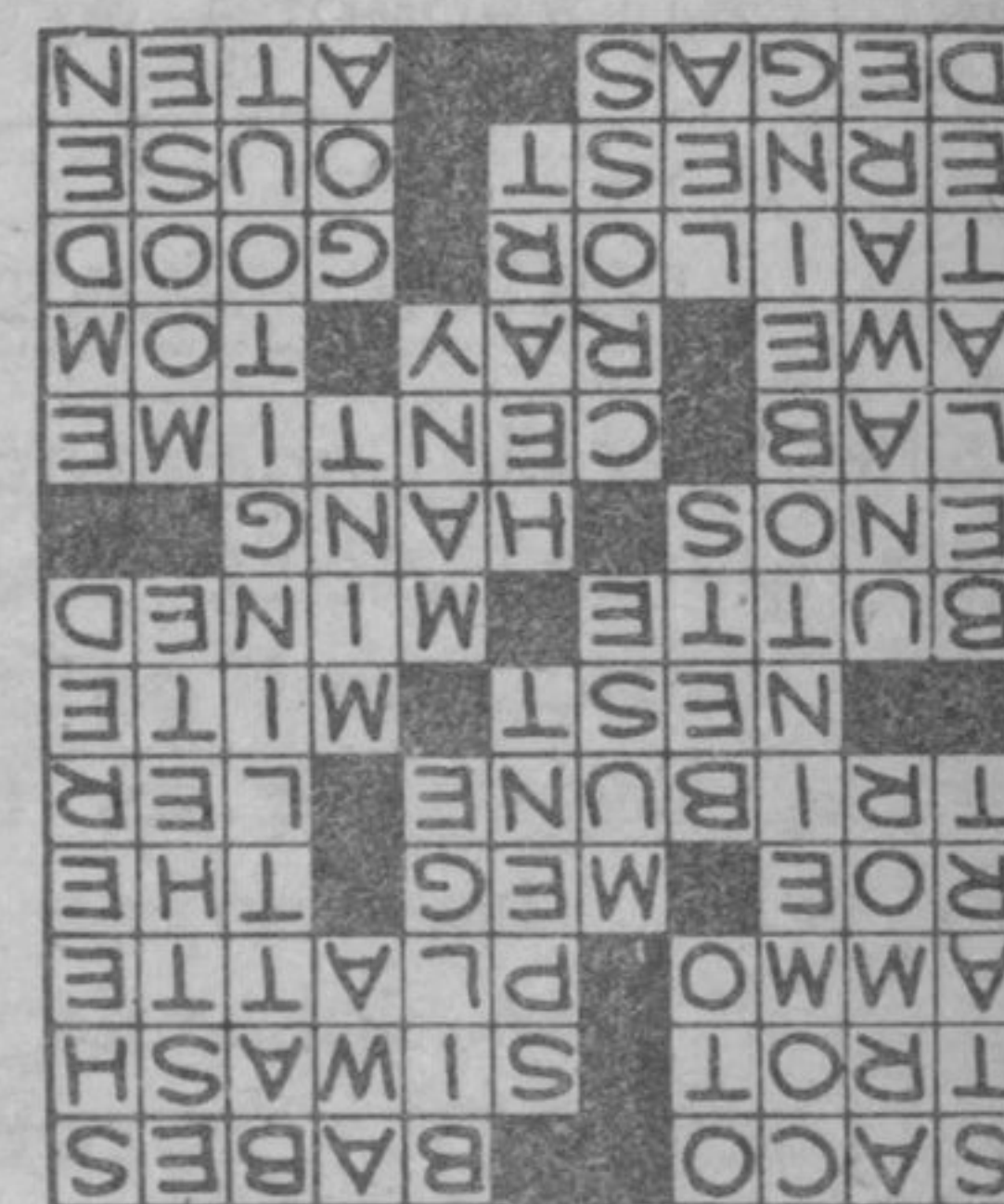
Gail and Terry Koenig with children, Greg and Terri-Lynn are here visiting with Gail's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Chester Dakin.

Joyce Jones and daughter, Sharon are here visiting with Joyce's sister and family, Bruce and Sharon Lundberg.

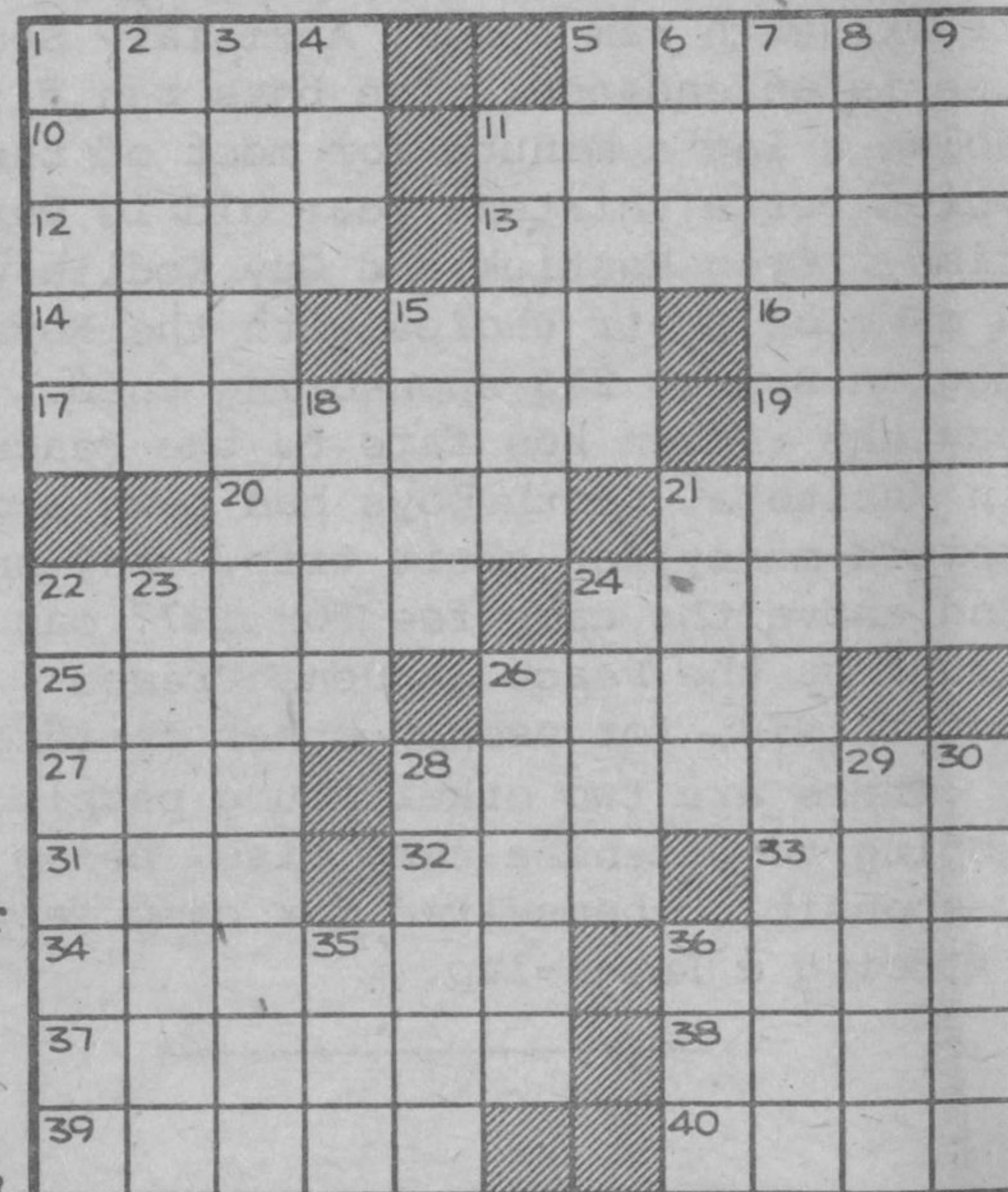
