How much do you really know about forest fires?

Statistics show that we don't know as much as we think we do, because every year people continue to be a major cause of forest fires throughout Ontario.

Test your knowledge of the causes, cures

and costs of forest fires. Read the questions below and tick the answer you think is correct. When you're finished, check your answers against the right ones and see how much you really know.

1. On the average, how many forest fires occur in Ontario every year?
(a) 200 (b) 800 (c) 1500
2. During the fire season, from April 1 to October 31, when no additional restrictions are in effect, which of the following is true:
(a) All fires are illegal (b) The fire danger is extremely high
(c) A permit is required for any fire not used for cooking or warmth
3. It is illegal to smoke while walking or working in the woods. When you wish to smoke you must:
(a) select a safe area, sit down, enjoy your smoke, then carefully extinguish your cigarette, pipe or cigar
(b) sit down, and when finished, discard your smoking material by throwing it away in the immediate area
