SMOKE DETECTORS:

The Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations has released a consumer information bulletin on the operation, installation and maintenance of smoke detectors. Now required in new homes under the Ontario Building Code, smoke detectors have recently become a "hot" topic among consumers.

There are two types of smoke detectors. Ionization detectors sense products of combustion often before there are visible signs of fire. Photoelectric-type detectors are

triggered when smoke impedes a beam of light in the unit. Both units respond much more quickly than the heat-activated units used in commercial and industrial buildings.

Prices range from \$40 to \$80 for the units which may be battery-operated, plug-in, or connected to the house wiring.
