TERRACE BAY AND SCHREIBER KINSMEN SPONSOR MOBILE EYE CARE UNIT

CHRONIC GLAUCOMA:

Chronic Glaucoma is one of the many eye diseases detected by an eye examination on the Mobile Eye Care Unit, a Prevention of Blindness Service to northern Ontario by The Canadian National Institute for the Blind.

"This disease which develops from a defect in the circulation system of the eye, is a leading cause of blindness in Canada," says Mrs. Charlene Cameron, Co-ordinator of the Service.

"If detected early, chronic glaucoma can u-sually be effectively controlled by the simple use of drops. In later stages, surgical procedures are used to assist natural drainage within the eye".

Mrs. Cameron said that there are often no symptoms until the disease is advanced. Victims may notice blurred eyesight, rings around lights and loss of side vision.

The Mobile Eye Care Unit will return to Terrace Bay from September 19th to September 23rd, sponsored by the Terrace Bay and Schreiber Kinsmen.

AMBLYOPIA:

"The earlier amblyopia is detected in child -ren, the better the chance of preventing need -less loss of sight" says Mrs. Charlene Cameron, Co-ordinator of the Ontario Mobile Eye Care Unit.

"The most common cause of amblyopia," she says, "is strabismus (popularly known as turned or crossed eyes). It also develops from a substantial difference in the seeing ability of the two eyes. If left untreated, this condition can lead to a loss of sight which cannot be restored."

"Treatment may include patching, glasses or in some cases surgery."
