

## The Canadian National Institute for the Blind MOBILE HEARING CLINIC

The CNIB Mobile Eye Care Unit was in Terrace Bay from Monday, September 19th to Friday, September 23rd. The Terrace Bay Kinsmen Club and the Schreiber Kinsmen Club sponsored the clinic and patients were seen from both towns. For the first time, due to patients for appointment demand in previous years, the length of stay was increased to a week.

Dr. Richard Merritt from Niagara Falls was the ophthalmologist for the week. Miss Sandy Friesen and Miss Jane Williams are the permanent staff with the van. The van has been travelling since the first of April and will return to Toronto in November.

Dr. Merritt found amblyopia or "lazy eye" to be the most prevalent eye problem seen during the week. Amblyopia is loss of vision without any pathological reason. If it is detected early enough it is treatable with patching and for this reason it is important to see an ophthalmologist if there is any suspision of any eye problem. Dr. Merritt states: "If amblyopia is found parents should ensure the protection of the good eye by obtaining protective eyewear for sports".

Other problems which were seen during the week were refracglaucoma and cataracts. One hundred and twenty five people were seen.
