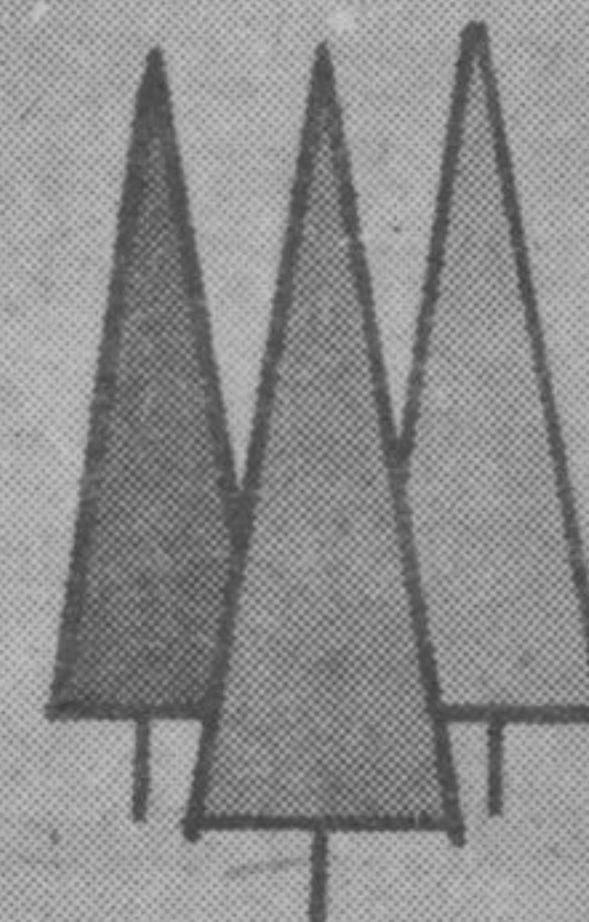

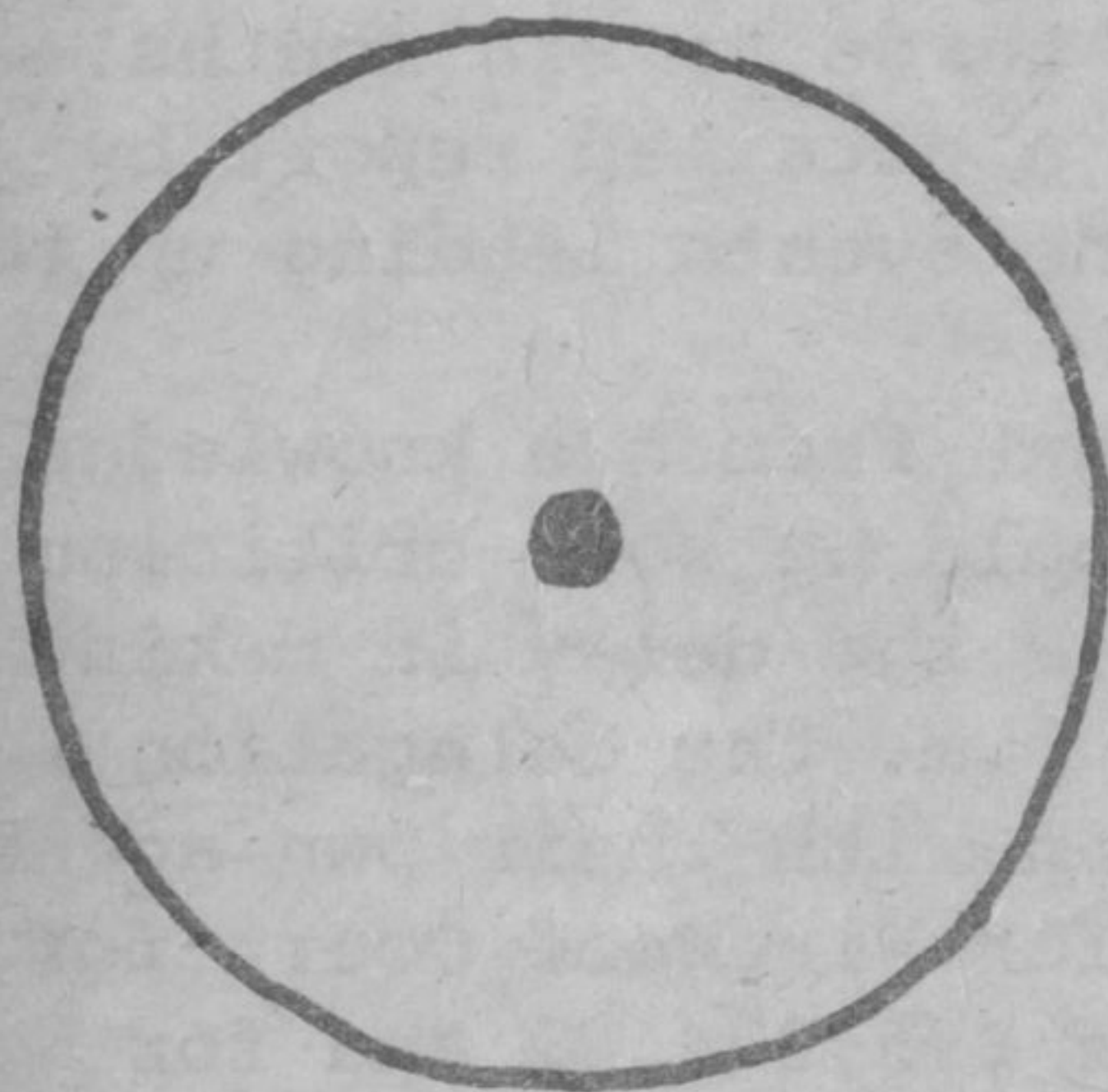

DELEGATION ATTEND BOARD MEETING

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Management of the District of Thunder Bay Home for the Aged was held on Friday, October 14, 1977 at Birchwood Terrace.

The meeting began at 12:00 p.m. with a dinner to which former Board members Mr. Fred Harness, Mr. Serge Desjardins and Mr. Curly Hale and their wives were invited. Mrs. Curly Hale was the only one able to attend and she was presented with a personal gift from the Board and a plaque for her husband honouring his service on the Board. Mr. Alex Daneff, Chairman of the Board explained that the plaques had been hand written by a Resident of Birchwood Terrace, Mr. Neil Smith.

Immediately following the dinner meeting the Board spent two hours with a delegation of four ladies from Schreiber and a gentleman from Terrace Bay. They had many questions centering on the operation of Birchwood Terrace and the recent termination of the Supervisor of Care Services. The Board was able to explain that Birchwood Terrace was a Residential Care Home, that it was the first Home in Ontario to have locks on its doors. Now this Policy has been adopted by the Ministry. This is very important as this gives them privacy if they so desire. Residents are only checked at night by request or because of sickness.
