TERRACE BAY POLICE DEPARTMENT

During the week of October 23rd to 30th the Police department were called upon to investigate a total of twenty-nine occurrences.

October 4th, found the police executing a warrant of committal upon a local resident as well as conducting five motor vehicle safety inspections.

October 25th - After a continuing investigation into the damage suffered by the Police Station window, a local youth was charged with committing this offence.

October 26th - Police investigated a disturbance caused by discharging a firearm, the sudden death of a local youth and charged one local resident with failing to remain at the scene of a motor vehicle collision.

October 27th a N.S.F. cheque fraud charge was laid.

October 28th - The following occurrences were investigated. A local resident was charged with impaired driving, a compassionate message was delivered to the construction site, a charge of speeding was laid under the Highway Traffic Act and a juvenile was dealt with regarding the theft of money from a purse that occurred in early August of this year.
