
REMEMBRANCE DAY CEREMONY AT ST. MARTIN SCHOOL

POLICE REPORT 6 TO 13 NOVEMBER 1977:

The Terrace Bay Police Force reports a relatively quiet week of November 6 to 13 with only thirteen occurrences registered.

Police are investigating a theft of a radio from R.J. Ball electric, which was stolen from their offices on the expansion site. This radio is a ground to air receiver and transmitter valued at \$3,000.00

During the week police also attended two family domestic disputes and three charges were laid under the Liquor Licence Act.

Police attended a shooting incident in which a young man is in critical condition in Thunder Bay hospital suffering from head injuries.

December 1st to 7th is Safe Driving Week in Canada. It is a time to resolve to improve our skills and to conduct ourselves in the traffic environment so that we will contribute to its safety rather than to its risk.
