PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND MUSIC AT ST. MARTIN'S

Last Wednesday 1977 11 16, the staff presented an overview of the curricular and extra-curricular Physical Education and Music programmes at St. Martin School. Mr. A. Speziale welcomed the parents and, with the assistance of Mr. B. Peters and Mr. T. Owens, explained the scope and purpose of Physical Education in the schools, the attitudes that can be fostered, and the types of opportunities given the children. Mr. Owens demonstrated with enthusiastic participation by those in attendance the Health Hustle - an exercising to music approach to physical fitness developed in Scarborough. The Health Hustle is being used throughout St. Martin School. Mr. Owens outlined the extra-curricular activities taking place at the school: these have been selected to complement but not compete with other local schools. To page 12
