THE NORTH OF SUPERIOR R.C.S.S. BOARD MEETING:

The North of Superior District Roman Catholic Separate School Board held its regular meeting on Saturday, November 19, 1977, in St. Brigid School, Nakina.

Approval was given to the minutes of Regular Board Meeting No. 8/77 held October 15, 1977 and to the Statement of Accounts for the month of October, 1977.

Two priority items for the Capital Forecast, 1978, will be submitted to the Ministry - Holy Angels School Schreiber - Gym; St. Brigid School, Nakina - 4 Classrooms, plus.

Children living a considerable distance from St. Martin School, Terrace Bay, are now bringing their lunch and lunchroom supervision is being provided.

A memorandum is being directed to the schools advising that student smoking is prohibited in schools, on school excursions, at school functions, etc.
