### BELL CANADA 1978 TELEPHONE DIRECTORIES

With a colorful Ontario wildflower cover and a return to a larger type for customer listings, the Northwestern Ontario telephone directory is making its annual January appearance.

Mail distribution of the new directories is scheduled to start next week, January 18, according to Terry Kerr, Bell Canada manager for this area.

Ontario's official flower, the trillium, is one of nine provincial wild flowers featured on the cover of the new book. A return to the larger type size is in response to customer complaints about the smaller type used last year as an economy measure to cut down directory size.

Bell Canada expects to deliver more than 43,500 directories this year, to Bell Canada customers in Northwestern Ontario, an increase of some 3,300 over last year.

After Feb. 3, customers should call "0" and ask for the Bell Canada business office, if a directory has not been delivered or an addit -ional book is required.
