This being one of the first columns for the New Year, I would like to bring to your attention a few points of interest for early 1978.

The deadline for converting driver's licences for classes higher than Class G is January 31, 1978. After this date anyone wishing to obtain a higher class licence will be required to go through the complete test conducted by the driver examiner.

Those who hold the former operators or chauffeurs licence and do not plan on driving vehicles over 18,000 pounds do not have to take any action. A Class G licence will be issued by NTC Toronto on the persons next licence renewal.
