 This should enable those who are concerned to contact the Ministry and to make their views known. Concerns and suggested revisions will be considered and any changes will be reflected in the Phase III - The Strategic Land Use Plan document which will be available later in 1978.

The Phase II report is available free-of-charge from all offices of the Ministry of Natural Resources from White River through to Manitoba and the Ministry hopes that all interested people and groups will take full advantage of this opportunity to input into the Strategic Land Use planning process.

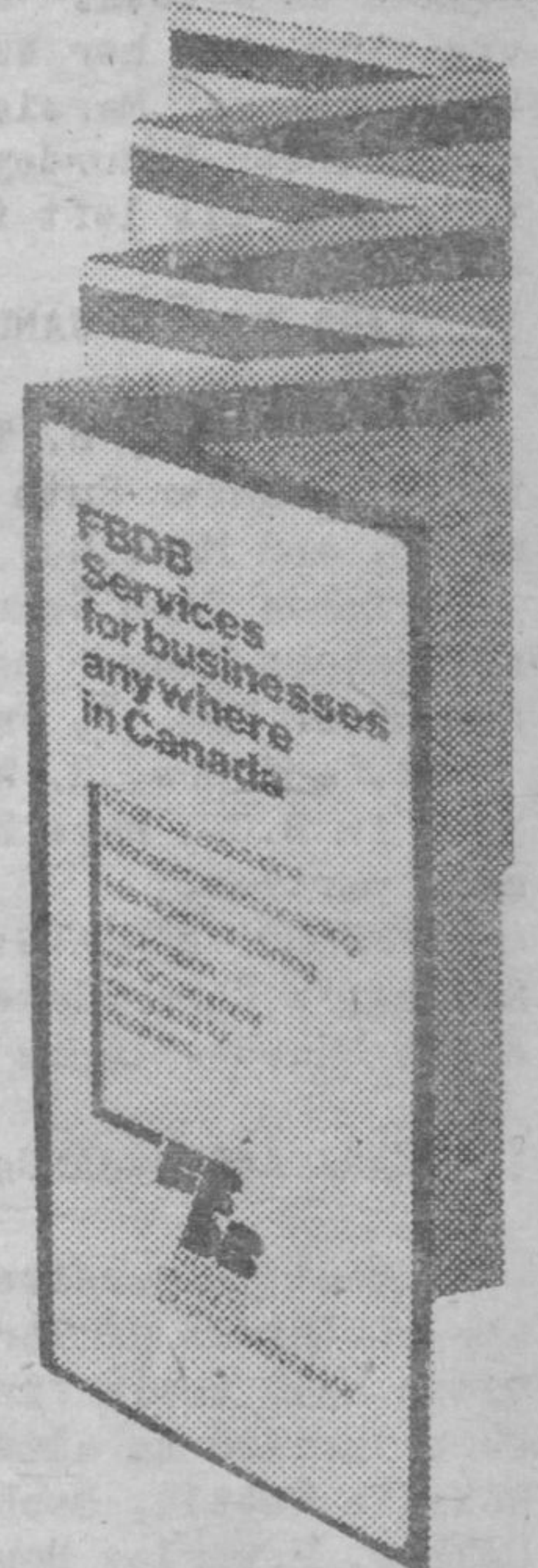

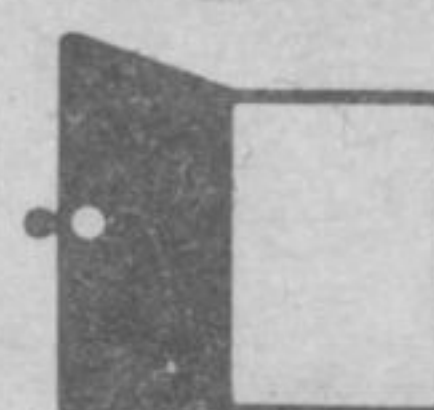
