EXTENDED SIDE-VIEW MIRRORS LIMITED TO TWELVE INCHES

TORONTO - The Ministry of Transportation and Communications announced today a new regulation limiting the size of side mirrors on motor vehicles, other than commercial vehicles.

Under the regulation, no driver may operate a motor vehicle on the highway with outside mirrors extending more than twelve inches from widest part of the vehicle, except when towing another vehicle or trailer.

The regulation came into effect Jan. 1, 1978, and is aimed at preventing needless accidents caused by motorists leaving extended mirrors on their vehicle when not towing a wide trailer.
