The Administrator stated that Confederation College is offering a Nursing Update Course here which consists of an 80-hour Nursing Refresher Course and a 40-hour Obstetric Course.

Dr. Croll reported he had contacted Mr. Gilman, Administra -tor of the Pt. Arthur General Hospital regarding the possibility of exchanging Nursing Staff so that our Nurses could acquire "on-the-job" training.
