New salary and wage rates for 1978 were approved, as was a by-law amendment which will provide for payment of overtime to non-department head salary staff rather than time off in lieu.


A by-law has also been passed to ensure that use of municipal equipment will not be used by private establishments except in emergency situations when no other contractor is available, and then only for a set time period.
