PENNER MP FOR FEDERAL COCHRANE RIDING

Thunder Bay MPP Keith Penner, known to many Terrace Bay residents, won the support of Liberal delegates at a convention in Hearst, April 21st and 22nd, and will be a candidate in the next election, representing the newly-expanded federal Cochrane riding.

Penner will be replacing Ralph Stewart, who has chosen to withdraw from the nomination race in order to spend more time with his family.

Gaetan Ouellette of Kapuskasing was Penner's only opposition. Final vote tallies were not divulged.

Cochrane extends from Lake Nipigon in the west to the city of Cochrane, totalling 118,700 square miles in area with a population of approximately 62,000.

Penner, who has been an MP for ten years, expects that Prime Minister Trudeau will call an election in June or July.
