The Arthritis Society has set a target of \$1,600,000 for its 1978 Ontario Fund raising campaign, Ian Macintosh, Ontario Division President, announced recently.

In this area the objective is \$2,484.00. Campaign Chairman in Terrace Bay is Mrs. Corrie Haas, in Schreiber, Mrs. Dorothy Rummery, and in Rossport Mr. Ray Kenney. Campaign Dates are September 18th to September 30th.

The money will be used in the Socity's programs of research and education. The Society's five year plan calls for the doubling of Rheumatologists, specialists in arthritis, in Canada.
