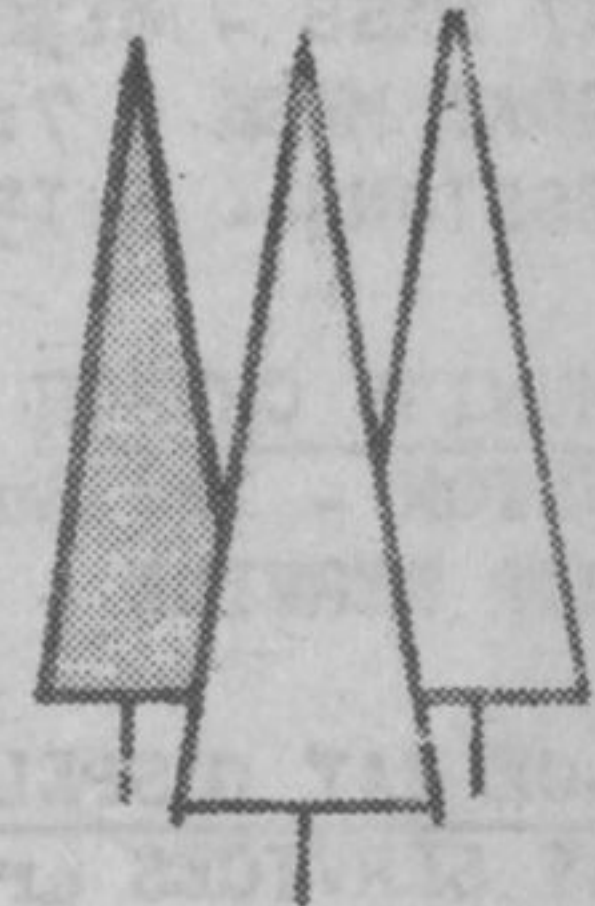

SCHREIBER - Meeting held September 19, 1978

Word has been received from Premier William Davis's office that Jack Stokes has been awarded one of the Queens Silver Jubilee Medals.

There will be an information meeting on September 28th from 1 - 5 p.m. in the lower hall of the Municipal Building in regards to the Townships proposed new Zoning By-law. All interested citizens are urged to attend.

The Ministry of the Environment is to be requested to do a Pollution Survey at Walkers Lake.

By-law 627, which is an Anti-Littering By-law was read and passed.

By-law 629, to amend By-law 375 to provide for No Parking from the corner of Subway and Scotia Sts. east 45 feet on Scotia St., and to provide for Angle Parking from the west end of the Flowers and Things Building west 145 feet on Scotia St. was read and passed.

Council to request Schreiber Hydro to upgrade the street lighting from the Lake Superior Board of Education Office on Winnipeg St. to the Bank of Montreal on Scotia St.

The installation of water and sewer lines from Ethel St. north on Peary St. and then east and west on Langworthy St. has commenced with the Town Forces carrying out the project.

The Arthritis Society has been given permission to canvas the Township in September.

Temporary drainage repairs are to be made to Bayview St. and Winnipeg Extension.

The Fire Departments old van will be put up for sale.
