The Junior girls wore pale mint green dresses of interlocking knit, flared sleeves, V-neck with lace edged collar, and bands with no ties. Lydia's dress was of white cotton with green flower print.

The girls wore a single yellow rose in their hair and Lydia had a halo of baby's breath. They carried three roses in an arm bouquet and Lydia carried a wicker basket with yellow roses, daisies and baby's breath.
