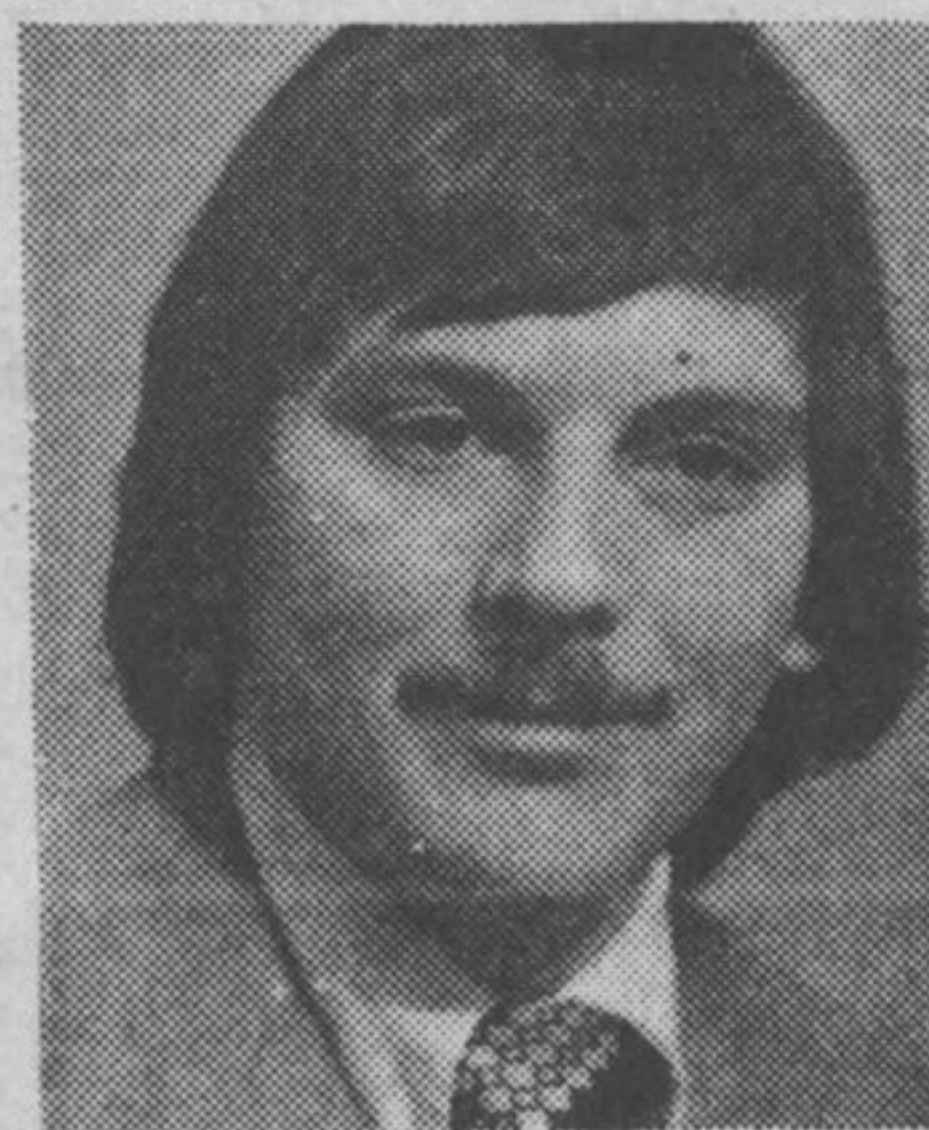

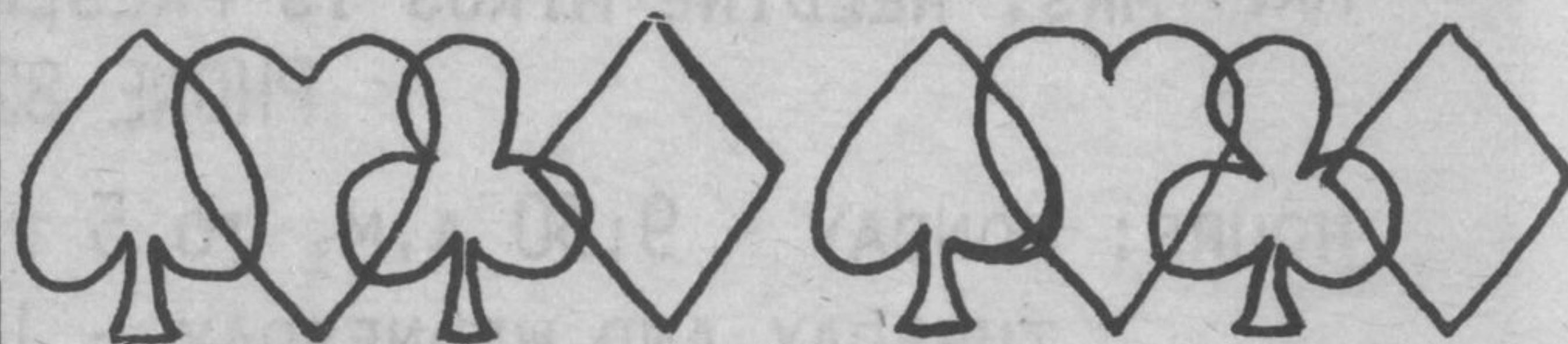
### MARRIAGE ANNOUNCEMENT
