Mrs. Margaret Spillane was commended for the excellent brides book she had prepared and it was decided to present this to Mrs. Debra Boag (nee McCanna).

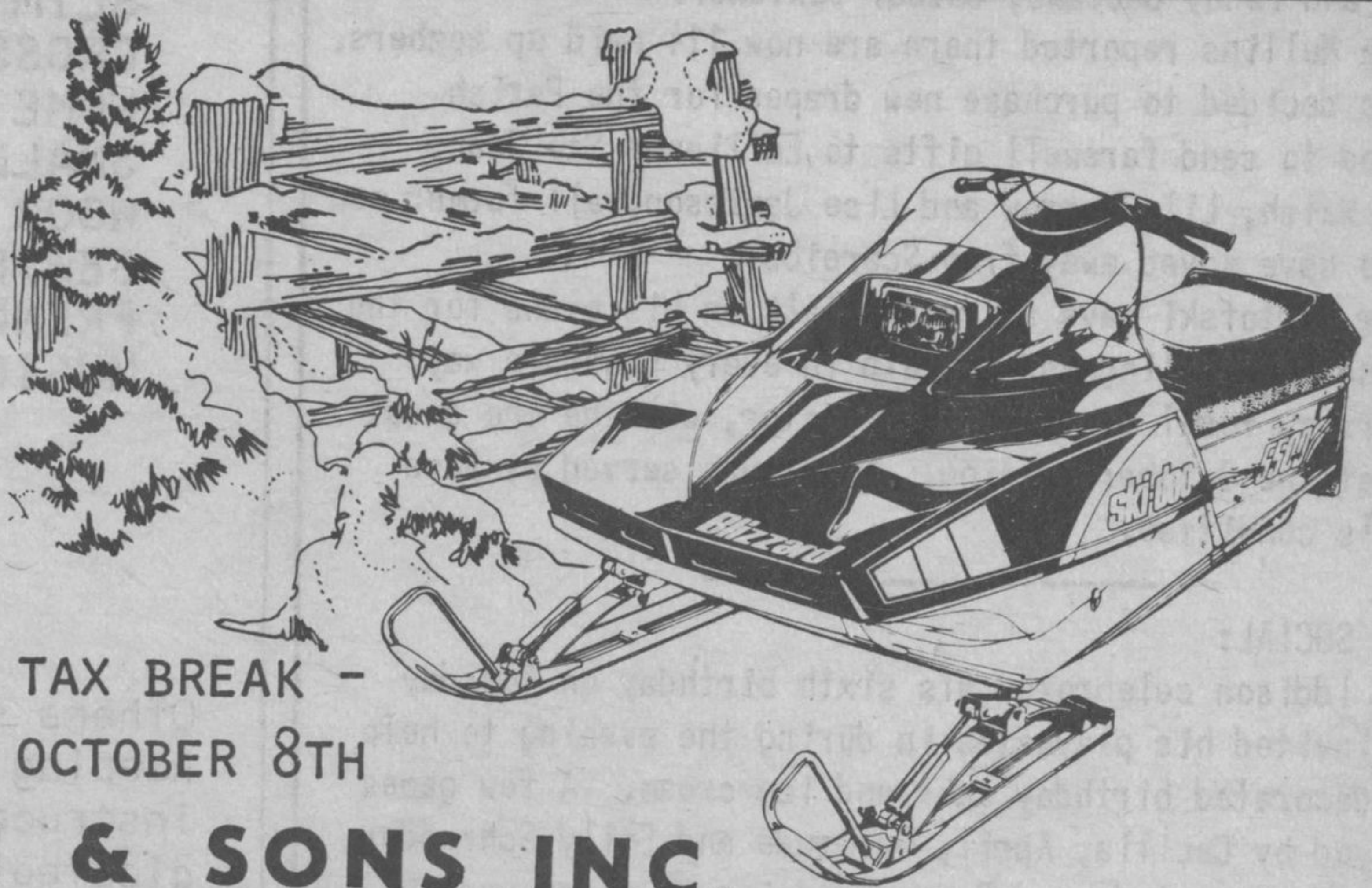
Mrs. Winnie Campbell read a lengthy list of cards sent during the summer for various occasions.
