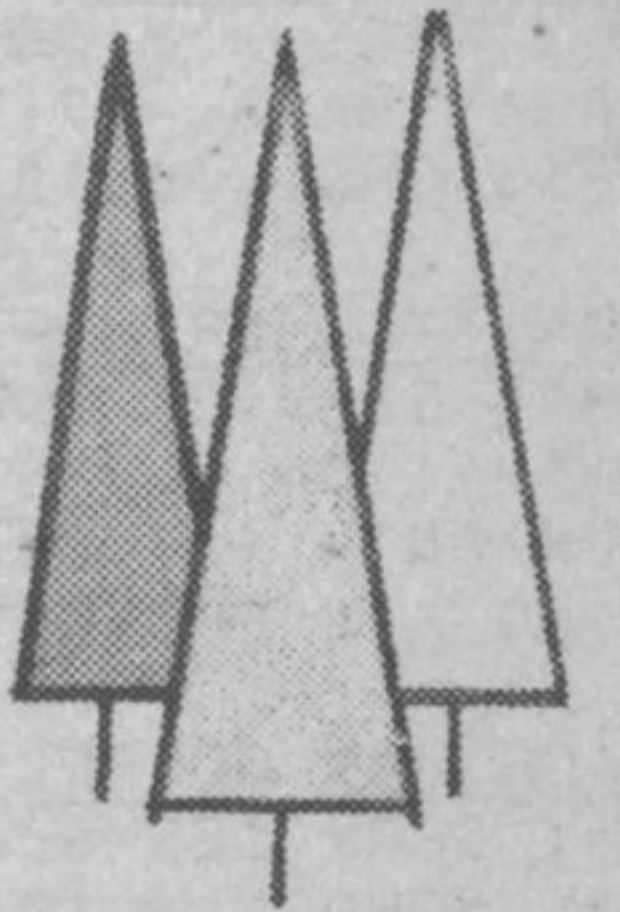

## JACK STOKES CELEBRATES ST. ANDREW'S DAY WITH LAKE SUPERIOR SCOTTISH REGIMENT
