Overture Concert

Overture's second concert of the season presented Daniel Llords of Llords' International, solo marionettiste, last Wed. evening, Dec. 6 in the Terrace Bay High School auditorium.

The programme, chosen by Daniel Llords for the evening, consisted of:

- 1. Les Petits Riens 13 brief pieces suggesting the yearly cy- terpretation were superb. cle - seasons come, overlap and go. Music was by Mozart.
- 2. Commedia Dell Arte (sentimental) a wistful romance between the rebuked Punchinello and the frivilous ballerina, Colombina. The familiar music was by Sir Arthur Sullivan of Gilbert and Sullivan fame.
- 3. Petrouchka a wandering charlatan (played by Daniel Llords) when you think about it, could they have done otherwise, conset up his tawdry stage and introduced his cast of characters - crude puppet figures that are the tools of his trade and of value only to provide an embittered wandering showman with bread and butter and vodka - this is not the story of a simple puppet but a reminder of mankind's desire for freedom. In the moving finale, the charlatan puppet master tore apart the body of Petrouchka. However the liberated spirit of Petrouchka

rose above the puppet stage to strike fear into the dark heart of the puppet master. Music was from Stravinsky.

4. The final brief portion was comic relief: "Maskenspiel" - a delightful non-verbal interlude for man and masks to music by Johan Strauss.

The concert was very well attended by members and to no one's regret. The agility of hands with which the marionettiste moved his characters across the stage and the perfect musical in-

Daniel Llords' love of his profession was definitely conveyed to everyone through his facial expressions and smiles as he performed in plain view of the audience.

The committee were well pleased with the attentive behaviour of the children, given throughout the evening. But then sidering the refreshing and memorable performance by Daniel Llords?
