Reeve Brassard also outlined some of the matters to be considered by Council as follows: Development - (a) Commercial continue efforts to encourage Kimberly Clark to allow Township to act as sale agent of the Company for the sale of commercial property in the Simcoe Plaza area as well as Highway frontage and South Camp properties. (b) Residential - monitor closely the present development of Terrace Heights with a view to extend services to additional lots so that we do not fall behind the demand for housing. Finalize plans to extend municipal water system to South Camp and Highway 17 east areas. Engage engineering consultant to finalize road development plan for Terrace Heights Subdivision with the view of completing as much as possible in 1979. To be funded from the proceeds from sale of lots.

Planning - consider the need to engage planning consultants to advise on the future expansion and parking facilities of the downtown area or reasonable alternative.

Hydro - consider the need to engage Ontario Hydro to perform utility maintenance as apposed to our present system of utilizing Kimberly Clark personnel.

Airport - consider further (1979) expenditures to provide full supply facility and fencing where necessary.

Public Works - re-activate capital expenditure plans to enlarge works garage; acquire road sweeper and landfill tractor; initiate plans for re-paving where necessary and curbing. Establish reserve fund for equipment replacement. Consider hard surface of Beach Road.

Recreation - consider means of extending use of our swim pool to four to six months per year.

The Committee of Adjustment has been authorized to attend a seminar in Thunder Bay during the spring of 1979.


The Recreation Committee budget will be re-allocated for the purchase of maintenance tools.
