However, add-ons aren't the only hazards. "Individual woodburning units and certified combination wood-oil units require careful installation and maintenance".

Fires can be caused by a build-up of creosote, a tar-like deposit from condensed wood gases. "Avoid using green wood or allowing any other materials to burn slowly to minimize the build-up. When your individual or combination unit is first installed, check daily for creosote until you have determined how frequently it will have to be cleaned out", Mr. Jones advises.

Chimneys designed for oil or gas may not be suitable for wood. Masonry chimneys should be carefully inspected inside and out to make sure they are in good shape and sized properly. Although factory-built chimneys which have been certified by the Underwriters' Laboratory of Canada may be adequate, Type B chimneys, generally used with gas furnaces, should not be used.

Safe clearances for wood-burning units are listed in the Ontario Building Code, available from your local library.

To make sure your unit has been safely installed, contact your local fire department. A free booklet, Heating with Wood Safely, is available from the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation, publications section, Montreal Road, Ottawa, Ontario KIA OP7.
