PROVINCIAL AID FOR SCHREIBER SEWAGE

SCHREIBER -- The Ontario government will invest \$116,000 towards improvements to existing water and sewage systems here, Northern Affairs minister Leo Bernier announced today.

Mr. Bernier said an agreement between the Ministry of Northern Affairs and the Township of Schreiber will allow the municipality to extend present services to include an outlaying recreation complex. The new system will be funded by Northern Affairs and will also serve as a base for future required development.

"As part of an ongoing program," Mr. Bernier explained, "the ministry assesses community needs and establishes priorities accordingly.

"In Schreiber's case, the result is a vastly improved infrastructure. Last year we funded the construction of a chlorination plant to purify the town water supply. Upgrading the sewage and water facilities now available is an extension of the program.

"Communities throughout the north, in everincreasing numbers, benefit from programs such as this; through efficient municipal servicing and improved lifestyles, Northern Affairs is providing for future growth.
