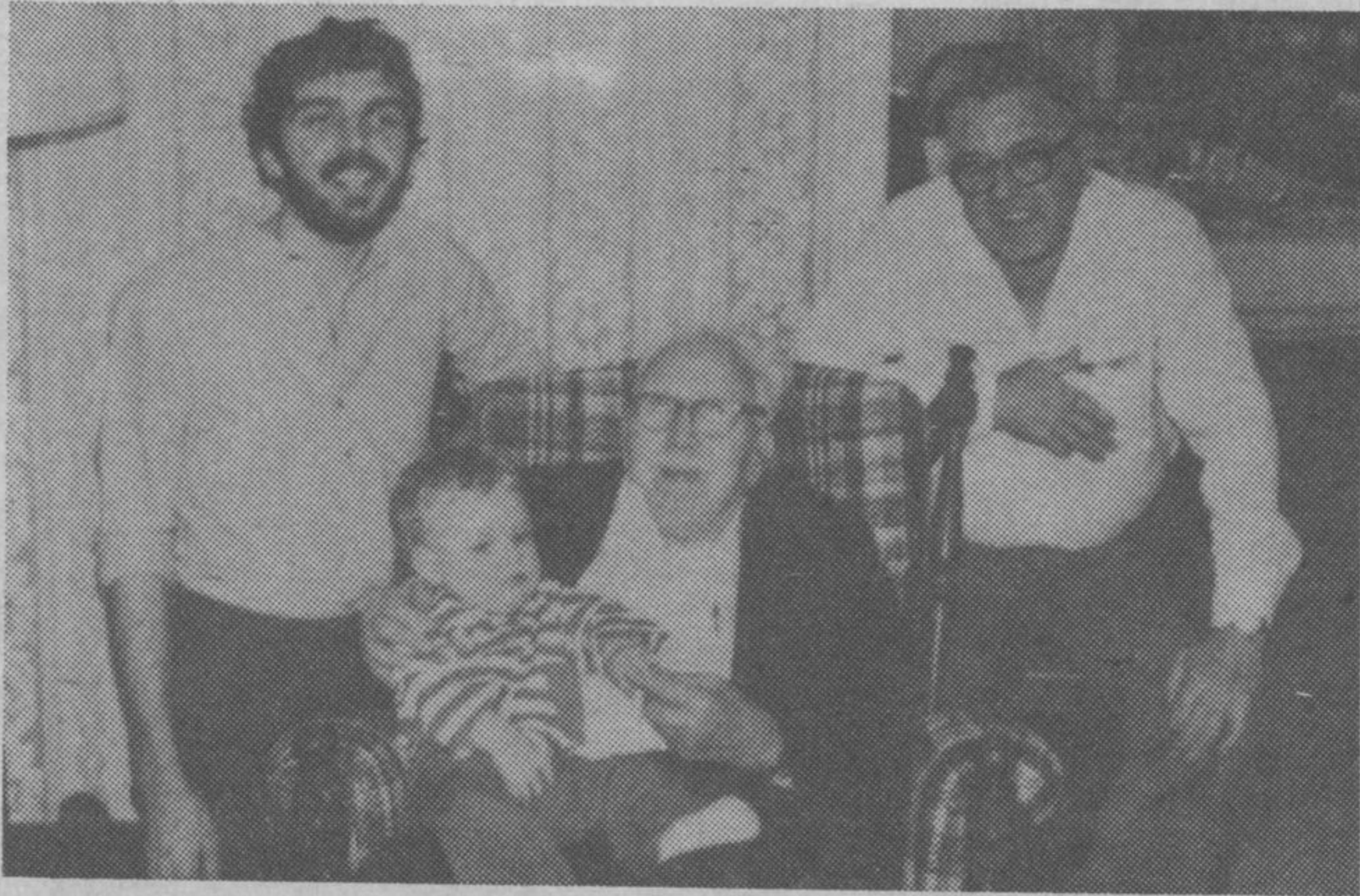


ALEXANDER CRUIKSHANK CELEBRATES 90TH
